

In follow up to last week's notification regarding Sixteenth Street Community Health Center's (SSCHC) COVID-19 testing capacity, IPN has been notified that three additional community health centers and one additional IPN office also have the capacity to perform diagnostic COVID-19 testing for patients who currently see other primary care providers that don't have the capacity to perform testing in their offices. Please find the information for referring any of your patients to these sites for COVID-19 testing below. Also, attached to this email is a flyer that can be shared with any of your patients that you are referring to one of the Milwaukee Community Health Centers.

If you need to refer your symptomatic patients to SSCHC for COVID testing, please implement the following protocols:

1. Have your patient call SSCHC at 414-672-1353 to schedule a time for the test
2. Provide your patient with your name, your office phone number and your fax number and instruct them to provide this information to SSCHC (so SSCHC can call you with any questions and fax any positive test results to you)
3. Notify your patient to follow up with you after they receive the test results from SSCHC

**Progressive Community Health Centers (PCHC)**

If you need to refer your symptomatic patients to PCHC for COVID testing, please implement the following protocols:

1. Have your patient call PCHC at 414-882-2040 to schedule a time for the test
2. Notify your patient that testing is currently done in a drive up fashion. Nasopharyngeal swabs are done with the patient in the car and sent to Wisconsin Diagnostic Labs for processing.
3. Provide your patient with your name, your office phone number and your fax number and instruct them to provide this information to PCHC (so PCHC can call you with any questions and fax any test results to you)
4. Notify your patient to follow up with you after they receive the test results from the RN Care Team at PCHC

**Outreach Community Health Centers (OCHC)**

If you need to refer your patients to OCHC for COVID-19 testing, please implement the following protocols:

1. Have your symptomatic patient call OCHC at 727-6320 to schedule a time for the test
2. Notify your patient to make sure they arrive at the scheduled time, to stay in their car when they arrive in the parking lot, that their registration will then be completed and they will

- receive a tele-visit on the phone or a live visit car-side by a provider, and will then get tested either by the provider or the National Guard or Firefighter EMS system.
3. Provide your patient with your name, your office phone number and your fax number and instruct them to provide this information to OCHC (so OCHC can call you with any questions and fax any test results to you)
  4. Notify your patient to follow up with you after they receive the test results from OCHC

OCHC has the capacity to do 35 tests per day now and has the ability to bump the number up to 50 or 60 based on demand.

**Gerald L. Ignace Indian Health Center (GLIHC)**

If you need to refer your patients to GLIHC for COVID-19 testing, please implement the following protocols:

1. Have your symptomatic patient call GLIHC at 414-383-9526 (Press 1 for the Medical Clinic, then when prompted, press 4 for COVID-19 Screening/Testing) to schedule a time for a test
2. Provide your patient with your name, your office phone number and your fax number and instruct them to provide this information to GLIHC (so GLIHC can call you with any questions and fax any test results to you)
3. Notify your patient to follow up with you after they receive the test results from GLIHC

**Village Primary Care Providers (VPCP)**

VPCP is performing screening testing for symptomatic patients as well as antibody testing.

If you need to refer your patients to VPCP for COVID-19 testing, please implement the following protocols:

1. Have your patient call VPCP at 262-239-7070 or you may call the office directly to refer a patient to schedule a time for a test
2. Notify your patient that testing for symptomatic patients will be done at curbside. Antibody testing will require a blood draw in the office.
3. Provide your patient with your name, your office phone number and your fax number and instruct them to provide this information to VPCP (so VPCP can call you with any questions and fax any test results to you)
4. Notify your patient to follow up with you after they receive the test results from VPCP
